14. Scientific and societal impact

It is fair to say, that I am one of the most active Finnish scholars who has since 2001 dedicated time and effort to both advocate, advance, and critically reflect upon the policy development and activism around UNSCR1325and I have played an important role in introducing the topics to be integrated into multi-disciplinary higher education curriculums and courses and advocacy to ensure the research funding, and institutionalisation of feminist peace and conflict research in Finland (see above).

I have published my research for a decade (2012-22) prioritizing Open Access (without payment) academic journals and book publishers – my main motivation for this has been to make my research accessible for scholars and students located in global south campuses. I have always also contributed my monographs to global south located university library collections – aiming for accessibility if OA option is not available.

In my collaborative research and publication processes, I emphasize ethics and promote underrepresented and early career researchers in their careers. This means for instance, that in majority of my publications between 2020-21 I do not enlist myself as the first author, although I have been PI of the project, and leading and facilitating the writing process.

Based on feedback form my colleagues across the world (such as UK, India, US), my research is widely used in under and postgraduate course syllabus.

My Academy of Finland fellowship (2015-20) reached several significant impacts I have been invited to talks, to give keynotes and expert talks, and screen my films to discuss both theoretical and methodological aspects of peace and conflict research but also the main findings of the empirical research: the continuing structures of intersectional inequalities and uncertainties for marginalized groups in the aftermath of the third-party mediated peace process (MoU Helsinki) and to analytically be better equipped to analyze and understand the intersections of gendered politics of reconstruction, entwined nexus of inequalities, disasters, armed conflicts and political violence – and ways in which non-elites respond and resist such violent logics in their everyday lives. These impacts

are reaching academic and policy making circles, but also through grassroots outreach initiatives (pop up film screenings and discussions at public spaces) non-academic audiences and wider publics.
