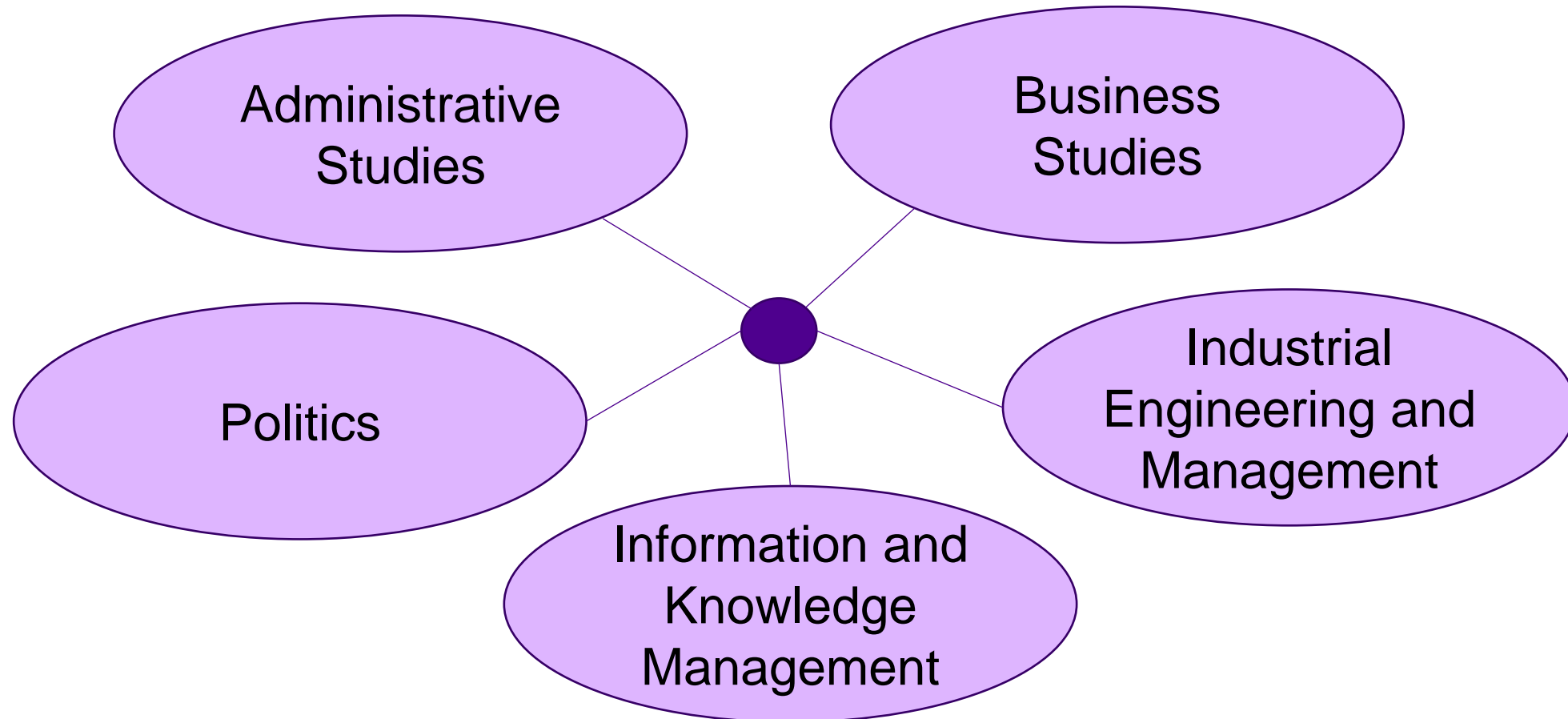

Research Development Priorities (1/2)

1. Fostering an inspirational research environment and culture

- We will foster a faculty-wide commitment to developing MAB into an increasingly attractive research environment and building a positive research culture.
- We will foster a sense of community and collegiality within MAB research community and develop events that support peer learning and the sharing of knowledge.
- We will support long-term research, the setting of ambitious goals and efforts to gradually increase the quality of research.
- We will develop the monitoring of publication output and related incentives.

2. Strengthening research resources and expertise

- We will support researchers' work (on-site services, incentives, supervisory work) and share good practices.
- We will highlight, support and strengthen career paths.
- We will rationalise the use of time and the division of duties.
- We will identify the potential of research and researchers and provide preaward support.
- We will support researcher mobility.
- We will adopt a strategic approach to planning the recruitment of associate professors (tenure track), postdoctoral research fellows and doctoral researchers.

Research Development Priorities (2/2)

3. Improving the quality and impact of research

- We will provide enhanced support and resources (such as the sharing of expertise relating to publishing activities, sparring, motivation, encouragement, research seminars, visiting researchers).
- We believe that the quality and impact of research will improve when the necessary resources are provided and researchers are able to devote time to research.

4. Increasing strategic and international funding

- We will allocate support and resources for supporting the preparation of strategic and international grant proposals (such as internal sparring, peer feedback, mentoring, enough time, incentives, support for researchers who seek but have not secured funding, the sharing of best practices).

5. Increasing the impact of research through inclusive measures

- We will develop the impact of research activities with a special focus on quality.
- We will ensure all researchers have a possibility to publish (resources, shared research seminars, sparring, peer learning, rewarding staff for publications).

6. Identifying the research and priority areas of the units

- We will continue discussing the strategic priority areas of the units in relation to their operational environment.
- We will tap into the opportunities for collaboration at the interface between different disciplines and research themes.
- We will discuss the shared research topics and themes at the faculty.
