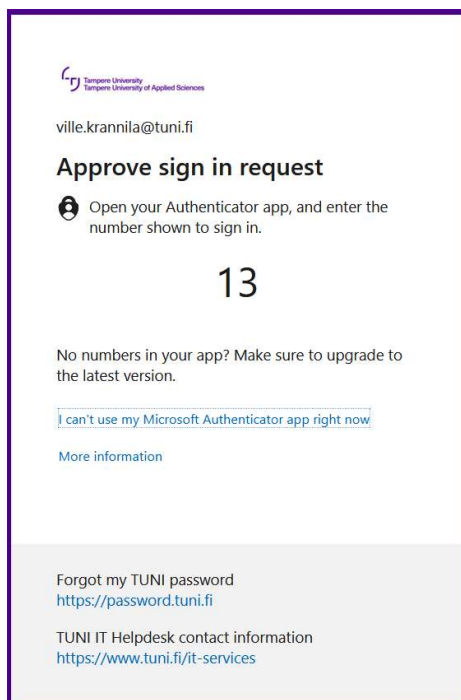


## Number matching

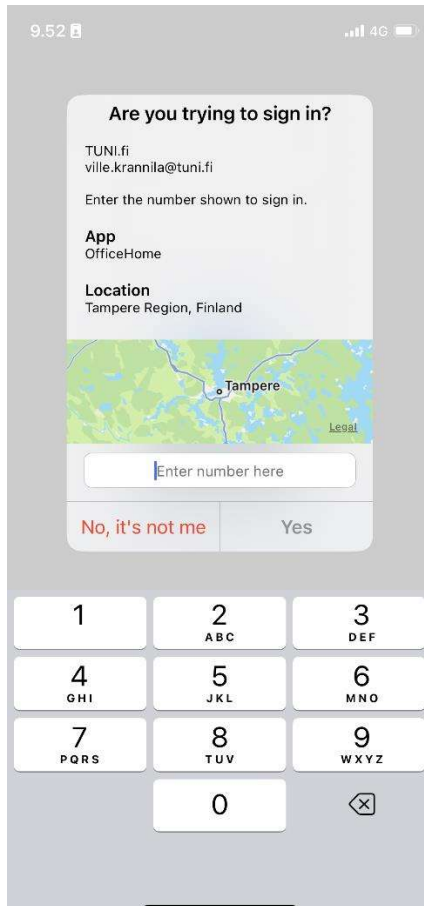
The expanded introduction of multifactor authentication has brought with it a new form of attack, the so-called MFA spamming which is an attempt to get the user to accept incorrect strong authentication approval requests for different services.

Once you have written your TUNI user account and password in the login window, you will see a number in the login window that you enter into your phone's Authenticator application (staff - work profile).



The user can see from the map if the request comes from a strange location. The map shows the location based on the IP address of the sender and does not use the location of the device. However, the location may vary for network technology reasons and is not always correct.

NOTE! If you receive a check-in notification and you are not logged in, choose *No, it's not me*. This is a confirmation that no one else will try to log in with your TUNI IDs.



Once the number matching feature is in use, you can also introduce a password-free login.
