

Privacy notice for financial obligations

Effective from 5 March 2025

Why do we process your personal data?

Personal data are processed to comply with anti-money laundering and counter-terrorism provisions and other mandatory compliance obligations related to the foundation's operations, as well as to conduct related background checks. The university foundation is obligated to maintain data, for example, on individuals who fall under the definition of related parties. In addition, financial institutions managing the University's investment assets are, under the Anti-Money Laundering Act, required to maintain up-to-date data on their clients, including actual beneficiaries and individuals defined as politically exposed persons under the Act. The University's investment services ensure that the asset managers have the most up-to-date information possible.

Background checks may be conducted using the DOKS system provided by Suomen Tunnistietieto Oy.

Do we use automated decision-making or profiling?

We do not use automated decision-making or profiling.

What personal data do we process?

- name
- personal identity code
- date of birth
- nationality
- email address
- address
- country of residence
- domicile for tax purposes
- political exposure of the person
- copy of passport/official ID

Why can we to process your personal data?

The grounds for processing personal data are:

- the data subject has given consent to the processing of their personal data
- processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which the controller is subject

Under the Act on Preventing Money Laundering and Terrorist Financing (444/2027), Tampere University has a legal obligation to obtain and maintain a list of its board members and, upon request, to supply this information to the obliged entities referred to in that Act.

Where do we obtain the personal data required for processing?

From the data subjects themselves.

Processors and disclosures of your personal data

The personal data are processed by: Suomen Tunnistetieto Oy and Certia Oy.

The data on the President, Board, Financial Director and Investment Manager are, upon request, supplied to the banks, financial institutions and finance companies that are the contractual partners of Tampere University Foundation sr.

Do we transfer your personal data outside the EU/EEA?

Personal data are not transferred outside the EU/EEA area.

How long do we keep your personal data?

All data are stored and deleted in the DOKS system. All data are saved in the DOKS system, and all transactions will leave a time stamp. If a customer relationship or agreement partnership no longer needs to be monitored, the data will be archived. The data retention period is 10 years. When their relationship with Tampere University Foundation sr ends, the data on responsible persons and their related parties are deleted.

What rights do you have as a data subject?

- Right to withdraw consent (General Data Protection Regulation EU 679/2016, Article 7, 3)

You have the right to withdraw your consent at any time if the processing of your personal data is based on your consent. The withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of our processing based on consent before the withdrawal.

- Right of access (Article 15)

You have the right to know what personal data are being processed about you and what data has been stored about you. In many systems related to admissions, you can view the information stored about you yourself when logged in.

- Right to the rectification of data (Article 16)

You have the right to ask that incorrect, inaccurate or incomplete personal data concerning you are rectified or completed without undue delay. You also have the right to demand that your unnecessary personal data are erased.

- Right to be forgotten (Article 17)

Depending on the basis for data processing, you may have the right to have your personal data erased from the University's register. Such a right does not exist, for example, in cases where the processing of your personal data is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation or for the exercise of official authority vested in the university (Article 17, paragraph 3b).

- Right to restriction of processing (Article 18)

In certain situations, you may have the right to request that the processing of your personal data be restricted until your data or the basis for processing it has been duly checked and corrected or supplemented.

- Right to object (Article 21)

Based on your personal, specific situation, you have the right to object at any time to the processing of your personal data when the processing is based on the performance of a task carried out in the public interest, the exercise of official authority, or the University's legitimate interest. In such cases, your data may only continue to be processed if there is a compelling and legitimate reason for the processing that can be demonstrated.

- Right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority (Article 77)

You have the right to lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority if you consider that the processing of your personal data violates applicable data protection legislation. You also have the right to seek other administrative and judicial remedies.
